Main Idea: Scriptural accounts of divinely ordered conquest and laws of Jubilee that support the rights of individual landowners stand in tension but are rooted in the perception that all the earth is God's.

4. Lesson Three: Food Justice (9:05)

Scripture: Genesis 1:22, 3:19; Exodus 16:13–18, 19–21; Joshua 5:12; Psalms 65:11–14, 78:23–29, 105:40–41; Hosea 4:1b–3; Micah 6:12–15; Matthew 13:8; Mark 4:8; Luke 8:8

Main Idea: The Bible portrays the earth as yielding food in abundance, and today's agricultural scientists say it could provide food for all. We can learn to produce food with justice and peace and feed a starving world.

5. Lesson Four: Water Justice (11:43)

Scripture: Genesis 1:2, 6–7, 9; 2:10; 3:17–19; 4:12; 5–6; 6–9; 7:17–24; 9:18–17; 12:10; 26:1; 42:5; 46

Main Idea: Water is so essential, and its presence and absence so impactful, that both Scripture and contemporary events reflect its multidimensional effects on human life.

6. Lesson Five: Air Quality (12:04)

Scripture: Genesis 1:26, 30; 2:7; 6:17; 7:15, 22; Psalms 32:2; 104:29; Job 7:11; Isaiah 42:5; Ezekiel 11:5; 37:5, 8, 10

Main Idea: The wind itself often signals a holy moment, and is related to both our

breath and God's, both our spirit and God's.

7. Lesson Six: Climate Change (11:43)

Scripture: Ecclesiastes 1:14; 2:24; 3:9–11; Isaiah 22:13; Jeremiah 37:11–16; Luke 12: 16–21; 12:19; 1 Corinthians 13:12 (KJV)

Main Idea: Scripture teaches us to listen to prophets who warn of threats, avoid complacency and self-concern, and participate with joy in the work God has given us to do.

8. Lesson Seven: Economic Climate Justice (10:59)

Scripture: Deuteronomy 15:7–11; Matthew 26:11; Mark 14:7; John 12:8

Main Idea: The Bible's economic wisdom never promises to eradicate poverty: "You always have the poor with you," it says instead. But we can reduce suffering and strengthen the entire social network.

9. Lesson Eight: Intergenerational Justice (11:45)

Scripture: 2 Kings 22:20; 23:25; 23:29–30; 24–25; 25:27–30

Main Idea: Like the authors who reflected midstream on the meaning of ancient Judah's story with God, who held onto unrealized hopes for their future, we have a story with God, a story whose meaning is changing.

10. Lesson Nine: Sustaining Creation's Health for All (11:41)

Scripture: Genesis 1:29–30; Psalm 104; Isaiah 2:1–5; Micah 4:1–4; Matthew 13:31–32

Main Idea: Scripture and modern science help us see nature's wisdom more clearly and lead us to seek just ways to care for the earth and one another.
